

Lincoln Institute Scholars Program

In 2012 the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy will be hosting a program for junior scholars in which recent Ph.Ds. specializing in public finance or urban economics will have an opportunity to work with senior economists. Those funded through this program will be known as Lincoln Institute Scholars. This program is organized by Daphne Kenyon and Dan McMillen.

Lincoln Scholars will be invited to the Institute on May 3-5, 2012 for a program that will include:

- presentations by a panel of journal editors on how to publish in public finance and urban economics journals,
- a workshop in which senior scholars will comment on draft papers or proposals written by the Lincoln Scholars,
- an opportunity for the Lincoln Scholars to make brief presentations on their research interests, and
- a seminar in which scholars in public finance and urban economics from around the country will present their latest research.

Applications require a letter of application, resume, a one page description of research interests, and a letter of recommendation from their department chair or dissertation advisor. Finalists will be chosen on the basis of: 1) their potential to publish significant research relevant to the Lincoln Institute and the Department of Valuation and Taxation (see Lincoln website for description of the Institute:

and 2) the likelihood that they would benefit from participation in the Lincoln Scholars program.

The Lincoln Institute will pay travel expenses for the Lincoln Scholars plus a \$500 stipend.
