# Statewide Maximum Qualification Income Amounts <br> For <br> Manufactured Home Personal Property Exemption 2013 

With the passage of Senate Bill 1449 in 2012, the qualifying income for the personal property exemption provided for in 68 O.S. § 2949 has changed. Qualification beginning January 1, 2013 is a maximum gross household income of $\$ 22,000.00$ or $50 \%$ if the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) median income for the preceding year for the county or metropolitan statistical area where the property is located. The Oklahoma Tax Commission will provide the maximum qualifying income each year. [ref: 68 O.S. 2012 supp. § 2949(A)(2)]
